MINUTES FOR MIAMI RIFLE & PISTOL CLUB 2018 ANNUAL MEETING October 20, 2018

The annual meeting of the Miami Rifle and Pistol Club was held at the Receptions Meeting Hall in Loveland on October 20, 2018. The meeting was called to order at 1:10 p.m., President Ben Laux presiding.

Board members in attendance: Joe Beeker Mike Bley, Beth Grote, John Grote, John Herdering, Ben Laux, Dale Rossmann, and Jeff Timmons.

Board members absent: John Smith

Secretary's Report: Meeting Minutes for 2017 Annual Meeting were read by Beth Grote. A motion was made and seconded to accept the minutes as read. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Presented by John Herdering. The club is in a good position to continue to make improvements and meet annual expenses.

Questions from the floor as follows:

- 1. Why are copies of Treasurer reports not available? John H explained that a late return from out of town business caused the printing issue. He will take email addresses from anyone interested and will email out copies of the Treasurers report before Sunday evening.
- 2. Since we had a profit did we file as an exempt organization? Answer is that as a non-profit, we do not pay income taxes.
- 3. Is the decrease part of the MPR yes, a chunk of depreciation change is on the Multi-Purpose Range.

Motion to accept treasurers report as read, seconded, and the motion carried.

Membership Report: Jeff Timmons reported that total membership is 2145. Membership waiting-list process enacted several years ago to control membership numbers is working. More people are starting to hear about the Accelerated Wait List (AWL) and are participating in it. Motivated people may reduce their time on the waiting-list by participating in matches and workdays. The club gains active and motivated members whose safe gun handling skills have been observed.

John Grote discussed rolling out the new **Membership Management System** (MMS). He demonstrated how to handle signing up for membership on a mock-up of the online system. Each member will be able to sign on and update their own information. Renewal starts 11/1. The use of the MMS will eliminate the delays of postal mail. Four emails will come to you as a renewal reminder. The payment system is encrypted to assure credit card payment security. Members who prefer to not use their cards online may use gift cards as payment to assure security. For those who do not renew by Dec 31st, there will be four additional emails in January, and one final email in February before being dropped from the membership list.

For members without a PC there is the option of coming out to the club on designated Saturdays and renewing online at the clubhouse.

Questions from the floor were as follows:

- 1. What if the primary member is deceased? How does one renew? *The surviving spouse will become the primary member.*
- 2. What happens when a Junior ages out and takes a full membership? *This should auto update on the Junior's birthday.*
- 3. Will there be badges? Yes, badges are a method of identifying club members and contain the chip that allows gate access. 2019 Stickers will be sent out this year.
- 4. Will there be more than one Saturday to renew at the clubhouse? *Yes, there will be multiple Saturdays.*
- 5. How is payment? *NO checks or cash accepted. Credit/debit card or gift cards will be used.*
- 6. Is there a sign-in spot on the book? *No we have your email.*

Presidents Report & State of The Club: Club is in a very good state, ranges have been operating safely, the new safety fence on the side of the parking lot is complete so people don't wander out on the HP range.

We've had a successful year of competitive shooting.

- Shooting starts, 5-28-2019
- Fun-with-Guns, 7-2-2019
- End of season shooting, 8-20-2019
- Party/Awards Night, 8-27-2019

There will be 6 to 7 open slots for new shooters. The prefered age would be 12-20 years old. It takes about 3 to 5 years to complete the program, which is divided in to five parts.

There is no cost for member or non-member young shooters. The program last for 12 weeks, per year. The requirement for the program is that a shooter must committ to attend 8 out of the 12 weeks.

Classess and shooting starts promptly at 6:30 PM, every Tuesday, all summer long. Boys and girls welcome.

In the classroom students are taught, firearms safety, how the firearm operates, care and maintenance of one's issued firearm. On the firingline the curriculum is teaching the students the four-position shooting, how to aim, trigger pull, and sighting. Students are expected to hit the targets during and after the season.

All equipment (firearms, ammunition, etc.) are supplied by the club for the whole junior program season.



Padawan Pistol Match

MRPC is excited to introduce a new discipline called the Padawan Pistol Match. This match is geared towards pistol shooters looking to have fun while honing their pistol skills. If you like using a handgun to poke holes in paper with no earthly purpose except to see if you can, then this may be the match for you. Everything is shot at 25 yards and you can use two hands

FAQ

Question: What days and time can I shoot in this Padawan match?

Answer: Match will be held on the 3rd Sunday of each month (April – October 2019) April 21st, May 19th, June 16th, July 21st, August 18th, September 15th and October 20th 2019. Match Registration is between 8:00 AM - 8:50 AM. Firing commences at 0900 (09:00 AM).

Question: What is the course of fire for this match?

Answer: The Padawan match consist a 90 shot aggregate match which consists of a 20 shots Slow Fire Match, a 30 shot National Match Course (10 shots slow fire, 10 shots timed fire, 10 shots rapid fire), a 20 shot Timed Fire Match, and a 20 shot Rapid Fire Match. The course of fire will be shot three times totally 270 shots.

Chart: Course of fire

Question: Do I have to shoot iron sights pistol only? Answer: No, you can use any sights including red dots and scopes, except laser.

Question: Are there any additional safety accessories that I should bring to the match

Answer: Yes, all competitors must wear eye and ear protection. Empty Chamber Indicators are a requirement. If you don't have one we will provided one to you at no cost. NOTE: We recommend that all shooters bring a staple gun for posting of targets, a clipboard and a pen or pencil for keeping score and masking tape for repairing targets when necessary.

Question: Can I just show up on match day and shoot in a match

Answer: Yes, however it's preferred that you reserve a spot by calling any of the match directors

Question: I don't have 22lr or 9mm pistol, can I still come and shoot.

Answer: Yes, we will have a limited amount of loaner 22lr pistol, however you MUST call a match directors prior to the match.

Question: What pistol am I allowed to shoot?

Answer: We recommend bring a 22lr or 9mm pistol (since 22lr pistol ammo is cheap I would shoot a 22lr pistol).

Question: How many rounds will I need to carry?

Answer: Each match you will need a minimum of 90 rounds and since you shoot three of these matches you will need at least 270 rounds. I suggest you bring some extra rounds in case you have any malfunctions.

Question: What is the entry fee?

Answer: The cost is a total of \$15 which includes targets and backing boards.

Question: Do I have to be a member of MRPC to shoot

in these matches?

Answer: No, these match are open to any competitor.

Question: Will competitors be able to win prizes?

Answer: Yes, cash prizes will to given to a shooter based




