Miami Rifle and Pistol Pistol League 2019

The MRPC Pistol League is an opportunity for the shooter to develop their pistol shooting skills. These skills are certainly transferable to other disciplines as well.

The basic shooting skills are Stance, Grip, Breath Control, Sight Alignment, Trigger Control and Follow-Through. All shooters use these skills in other matches or at the Multi-Purpose Range but in Pistol League, as it's the foundation for Precision Shooting, there is additional emphasis.

For some, this match may seem intimidating, but we've had very novice shooters participate and do well. One of the reasons for this is the coaching and encouragement of other shooters. Pistol League occurs on Thursday at the upper Pistol Range. There is both a morning and evening match. The match fee for members is \$3.00 and \$4.00 for non-members. We also offer an optional abbreviated Revolver Match for an additional \$1.00.

The course of fire (called a National Match Course, NMC) follows:

Course	Distance	Time	Number of Rounds

Timed Fire	25 yd	20 Seconds	Two strings of 5
Rapid Fire	25 yd	10 Seconds	Two strings of 5

Miami Rifle and Pistol, 3 Position Smallbore Rifle

3 position rifle matches will debut this year at the MRPC smallbore range. This is open to .22 LR and .177 air rifles. These are 60 shot matches with 20 slow fire shots each in the kneeling, prone and standing positions. Matches will be on the third Saturday of the month, March through October, except July, to let you attend the National Smallbore matches. Check the MRPC calendar. Signup begins at 8:00, firing at 9:00 AM and should take about 2 hours. Match fees will be \$5.00. Juniors shoot for free.

The matches are not CMP or NRA registered or approved, but CMP rules will be followed. These are club matches to be used for practice and preparation for sanctioned matches, so follow the spirit of the rules as best as you can. Rules are available at http://thecmp.org/competitions/smallbore

PRESIDENT'S LETTER



We are well into the shooting season and I hope everyone has had time to get out and enjoy the club this spring. With everyone out on the range I would like to remind everyone to please review the safety rules for the ranges and if you bring guests please make them aware of the rules. Also, some of you may be contacted concerning your membership status with the NRA, per the club's bylaws to be a member of Miami Rifle and Pistol you must be a member in good standing with the NRA.

It is a little early but please save the date October 19 to attend the Club's Annual meeting. We expect to have wonderful door prizes, but more importantly it is a chance to visit with other club members and elect the new Directors to the Board. I hope to see everyone there.

Safety is everyone's responsibility especially shooters. We've all been around firearms and unfortunately that familiarity can make us lax in our safety procedures on the range. like to highlight a few problems that have come to my attention that need to be addressed. The first is the bench rest range, when the range is cold and there are people down range hanging targets NO HANDLING OF FIREARMS at all, even if the bolt is out of the rifle. The use of an empty chamber indicator is required unless the firearm is cased. During a ceasefire everyone should be behind the painted yellow line away from the benches unless down range hanging targets.

The second is gun handling in the pistol pits. We've had instances of accidental discharges and a couple injuries result from improper gun handling when

holstering a loaded handgun while practicing in the pistol pits. Your finger should only be on the trigger when the gun is pointed at the target. Luckily no one was seriously injured, but if these accidents continue the Board will have no choice but to evaluate allowing drawing from a holster only during supervised matches.

We have signs posted at each range with rules to keep you safe, please follow them. If you have a question about them or need a clarification contact a member of the Board. Failure to follow the safety rules can result in injury and is grounds to have your club membership suspended or expulsion.

Per the club bylaws every member of MRPC is required to be a member in good standing with the NRA. We have audited our membership rolls with the NRA and found a few delinquent members. Each will be given a grace period to correct the issue before they lose their range privileges.

October 19 is the annual meeting where you will have the chance to elect new members to the Board of Directors. As usual this year there will be three seats up for election, Dale Rossmann, John Toll, and Myself are at the end of our terms. Dale and I have both served multiple terms and will not be running again. Hopefully John Toll will run since he has only served a year on the board filling out the term of a board member that resigned. For Miami Rifle and Pistol to continue to be a great club please consider stepping up and serving on the board. In addition to the election we will deal with any other club business brought before the membership, up to an including any constitution and bylaw changes or amendments. The meeting will be at Receptions in Loveland the same place we've had it the last 2 years. I hope to see you there.

Here is a basic rundown of the match format and rules



Please visit the CMP website for all the details.

Empty Chamber Indicators (ECI) are REQUIRED for both 22 and air rifle. Eye and ear protection is highly recommended.

The match will be three stages, fired in the following order:

- Kneeling unlimited sighting shots, 20 shots for record, fired in a 30 minute time limit.
- Prone unlimited sighting shots, 20 shots for record, fired in a 20 minute time limit.
- Standing unlimited sighting shots, 20 shots for record, fired in a 40 minute time limit.
- Smallbore firing will be done at 50 yards on A23 targets, with 5 shots on each bull.
- Air rifle firing will be done at 10 meters on AR5/10 targets with 1 shot on each bull.

There will be a 5 minute adjustment and 3 minute non-firing preparation period before each stage. You may handle and adjust your rifle during the adjustment period with the ECI installed. Observe muzzle direction

safety at all times.

Smallbore shooting coat (buttons), trousers, shooting shoes are allowed, but must be used for all 3 positions. If a highpower shooting coat (straps, hardback) is used, you may not use shooting trousers or special shooting

shoes.

A kneeling roll is allowed under the rear foot for the kneeling stage only. A second kneeling roll will be allowed between your heel and butt for shooters over 50 or who physically need it. I will have a few extras to loan.

Only one rifle may be used for the entire match, but exchanging butts, sights, cheekrests, risers for different positions is allowed.

Slings are allowed and recommended for kneeling and prone, but may not be used for standing.

Spotting scopes, ammo holders, rest stands are allowed, but may not be used

for support during firing.

Iron sights (including match type) or scopes may be used throughout the match. You cannot change from one to the other.

If a position is not physically possible, a shooter may fire that stage from the next higher position.

Sorry, no bench or F class allowed. You have to stand up on your hind legs and hold the rifle.

Come on out and give it a try. If you are a beginner, you can get help and coaching from some of the excellent rifle shooters at MRPC. Everyone is willing to help new shooters. Or if you are experienced, you can hone your skills and get in some good practice for Nationals. Remember, the Tokyo Olympics are less than a year and a half away.

COME JOIN US AT MRPC "Padawan Pistol Match"

Come Shoot our new discipline called the Padawan Pistol Match. This match is geared towards pistol shooters looking to have fun while honing their pistol skills. If you like using a handgun to poke holes in paper with no earthly purpose except to see if you can, then this may be the match for you. Everything is shot at 25 yards and you can use two hands

Question: What days and time can I shoot in this Padawan match?

Answer: Match will be held on the 3rd Sunday of each month (April – October 2019) July 21st, August 18th, September 15th and October 20th 2019. Match Registration is between 7:50 AM - 8:50 AM. Firing commences at 0900 (09:00 AM).

Question: What is the course of fire for this match?

Answer: The Padawan match consists of a 90 shot aggregate match which consists of a 20 shots Slow Fire Match, a 30 shot National Match Course (10 shots slow fire, 10 shots timed fire, 10 shots rapid fire), a 20 shot Timed Fire Match, and a 20 shot Rapid Fire Match. The course of fire will be shot three times totaling 270 shots

Question: What pistol am I allowed to shoot?

Answer: Any safe rim fire or centerfire pistol you can shoot all day, (We highly recommend a .22LR pistol)

Question: How many rounds will I need?

Answer: Each match you will need a minimum of 90 rounds and since you shoot three of these matches you will need at least **270 rounds**. I suggest you bring some extra rounds in case you have any malfunctions.

Question: Do I have to be a member to shoot in this match?

Answer: No you don't have to a member to shoot

Question: What is the entry fee?

Answer: The cost is \$12 for members and non-members is \$15. This fee includes targets and backing boards.

Question: Do I have to shoot iron sights pistol only?

Answer: No, you can use any sights including red dots and scopes, just NO lasers.

Question: Are there any additional safety accessories that I should bring to the match

Answer: Yes, all competitors must wear eye and ear protection. Empty Chamber Indicators are a requirement. If you don't have one we will provided one to you at no cost. **NOTE:** We recommend that all shooters bring a staple gun for posting of targets, a clipboard and a pen or pencil for keeping score and masking tape for repairing targets when necessary.

Question: Can I just show up on match day and shoot in a match


Answer: Yes, however it's preferred that you reserve a spot by calling or emailing any of the match directors

Question: I don't have 22lr pistol, can I still come and shoot.

Answer: Yes, we will have a limited amount of free loaner 22lr pistol, however you MUST call or email a match directors prior to the match.

The course of fire (called a National Match Course, NMC) follows:

Course	Distance	Time	Number of Rounds
Slow Fire	50 yd	10 Minutes	10
Timed Fire	25 yd	20 Seconds	Two strings of 5
Rapid Fire	25 yd	10 Seconds	Two strings of 5

This NMC is shot twice. The first course is fired using a handgun in .22LR. The second course of fire can be shot with a handgun in .22 LR or in a centerfire caliber. Between each sequence, with a cease-fire, the shooters go downrange to score and affix a new target. The match takes approximately one hour to complete.

The optional Revolver match takes approximately 40 minutes to complete and there is only one NMC as outlined above.

Pistol League starts the first Thursday in April. The morning match is at 10:00 AM with the Revolver match following. In the evening the Revolver match begins at 6:15 PM with the main match beginning at 7:00 PM. We've had shooters of all abilities, ages and handicaps. So assistance is available.

Hope to see you on the range and enjoy this match.

PRACTICAL PISTOL CLINIC

The purpose of the clinic is to familiarize members with USPSA shooting here at MRPC, in an environment that doesnit have the pressures of a match. Members who already shoot Practical Pistol coach the participants.
