PRESIDENT'S LETTER



Hello,

This October flew by, mostly due to the Annual Meeting that was held on Saturday October 24th at the club. 105 people RSVP'd, 43 attended the fairly cool and damp day. The meeting moved along as briskly as the breeze. The votes went as smoothly and quickly as you could hope for. The constitutional change to change the title of VP Property to VP Information Technology and Inventory was approved. The change to paragraph 302 of the Bylaws to read : 302: Must be a member in good standing of the National Rifle Association; Spouses and Junior members are exempt from this rule only.

Being on the Board of Directors is so rewarding that 2 of the 3 members whose term expired decided to run again! Scott Galloway has been serving as our Secretary and does an outstanding job; Scott was elected for another 3-year term. Todd Prickett has been the VP Property, now IT&I, Todd was elected to another 3-year term. Joe Beeker has been my Vice President and is a true asset to the club. He is kind, selfless, helpful, thoughtful, a good Man. Due to his advancing age and the need for a good nights sleep, Joe decided it was time to retire. I will truly miss his good humor and advice at the board meetings.

Newly elected to the Board of Directors is **Mr. John Goss**. Mr. Goss joined our club after re-locating from Washington State in 2010. Mr. Goss actually introduced me to MRPC and USPSA! John Goss and I have spent many hours together driving

to various matches around the area; he is a really smart and practical person; which makes him a great addition to the Board. Mr. Goss is very proficient with both rifle and pistol; please help us welcome him to the Board.

Miami Rifle and Pistol Club member survey results are in!

Member Survey Results: More than 5 mentions:

Main Driveway Bridge: Back around 2016 the Board first asked for a budgeting quote on a bridge for the Multi-Purpose Range Crossing. When that quote was \$285,000.00 it shut the subject down for a while. Our treasurer was also insisting any bridge be a draw bridge which also slowed this project due to the cost. This year we have an acceptable budgeting quote and once we have nailed down solid plan with the builder, as long as the price hasn't changed too much from the original quote; I think the BOD will approve it.

Plinking Range: Not going to happen, people don't clean up after themselves. If you want to put clay birds on the hill at the Multi-Purpose Range Bay 1, you can go forward to the marked target line and throw them on the hill. If you want to place clay pigeons on the hill at MP Range Bay 1 you need to ask for a Cease Fire for Bay 1, Bay 2, and Bay 3. **Training Classes/Clinics:** This has been happening, more this year than ever before. If you are asking for more Training Classes/ Clinics there is one absolutely sure way of making it happen: do it.

Shotgun Range: This year the Board took a hard look around the property and decided we just don't have a place for traditional shotgun disciplines. You are allowed to shoot a shotgun in Multi-Purpose Range Bay 1, but not at club provided targets. You are also allowed shotguns at bullseye and Pistol Pits 4-6; but no shooting at club provided targets. The main reason the clay thrower that used to be at the Bench Rest Range was removed was people not cleaning up after them selves; though there are other considerations there.

More Pistol Pits: Now you are talking! This

is something I would like to see happen and have been actively pursuing . Ideally, I'd like to add enough pits to be able to conduct major, regional USPSA or SCSA matches without impacting other MRPC disciplines. The issue is where are we going to do that and can we afford to move the dirt required? Not sure at this point.

Paved Driveway: Our driveway is the nicest gravel road I drive on. No Board I have been on has seriously considered paving the drive.

Bridge to Smallbore Range: This has been discussed, along with a bridge to the High Power Range Impact Area. This is an expensive project, for access to a single range that we just spend 40k on; I think it will be a few years if it happens.

Member Survey Results: 3-5

Use of Driveway with HOT HP Range: Boy oh boy is this an expensive one! As a member who makes a couple of trips to the range per week, I rarely, get held up by the HP Range. I have never had the shooters exceed the allowable closure time. Now while I do think turning the HP Range into Pistol Pits would open the road I am not willing to fight that battle.

Steel on the HP Rifle Range: The Board took a walk and looked it over earlier this year, and decided that it was not appropriate because of the way our impact area is setup.

Improve Walking Bridges: I am going to look into this, having walked across them, and knowing how long they have been there, we should be looking into this.

Rifle Range allowing Movement: We assume for something like 3-gun practice. The Board looked at this request earlier in the year and decided that allowing rifle rounds in the pistol bays has been against our rules and will continue to be against the rules. There is nothing in the rules against using an AR9 in the pistol pits. Just keep in mind that during practice all rounds must impact the rear berm only, not the side berms.

Remove NRA Requirement: while the press/media has been reporting the NRA to be a mess; the NRA is still the largest second amendment rights lobbying organization out there. We have been associated with the NRA for a long time and I am asking for a little patience for them to sort themselves out.

Club Wide WIFI/Cell: If anything drives this at MRPC it will be electronic scoring. No BOD I have been a part of has considered this. No club I have shot at has area wide WIFI, though some clubs do create a temporary network just for scoring of large matches due to the rules of those matches.

At the November 4th meeting of the Board of Director's elections for the Executive Board were conducted and all the other positions sorted themselves out.


Membership Renewal

President's Call to Order: The 2020 MRPC Annual Meeting was called to order at 12:30. John Smith presiding.

Welcome and Pledge of Allegiance to the United States was led by John Smith

The invocation was given by John Smith

Approval of Minutes:

Scott Galloway, Secretary, was introduced to present the Minutes for the 2019 MRPC Annual Meeting. Copies were distributed. A motion to receive to forgo the reading of the Minutes and to accept them as written. The motion was seconded and John Smith opened the floor for questions. No questions were recorded. John Smith called for a vote which was unanimously recorded.

Treasurer's Report:

John Herdering, MRPC Treasurer, reported on financial status and account balances, deposits and expenditures for the year. A motion to receive the treasurer's report was received and seconded. A called vote was received and was unanimously recorded.

Membership Report:

John Toll, VP Membership, reported on the MRPC highlights for the year. As of September 2020 the club has 2105 active members with 81 applicants having completed their orientation yet needing to complete their eight hour work requirement. There remains 1,474 applicants on the waiting list. Both the April and May orientations were cancelled due to the Covid-19 shut-down. Normally, 30 applicants are invited to the orientation per month with 15 – 20 actually attending. To maintain social distancing guidelines, John reduced the invitations to 15 and both called and emailed to confirm attendance. Absentees were replaced with the next applicant on the waiting list. In June, John conducted two orientations to make up for the April and May cancellations. Since August, Mark Dorger has assisted John with the orientations. with Mark's extensive experience in conducting the new member orientations, he recommended that John invite 30 applicants, and if the attendees grew to a number that exceeded safe limits, the applicants would

be split with into two groups rotating between classroom and tour. John reminded the members to update their Profile information on the Membership management System to keep their data current. He stated that on or about November 1st members should expect an email concerning the 2021 renewal process. Members without emails on their profile will receive a reminder postcard in the US Mail. Members are expected to register online, however, John will be available in the clubhouse on Saturday morning from 10:00 – Noon throughout December to assist with registration. Those individuals receiving John's assistance are reminded to bring either a credit/debit card or an activated gift to pay their dues at that time.

John Smith called for questions for the VP membership. None recorded.

President's Report:

John Smith, President, highlighted and explained the following projects that were completed in 2020:

New Small-bore Structure, High Power Range Drainage Improvement @ 200 Yard Line, Rebuild 200 Yard Berm on Bench Rest Range, New Discipline Steel Challenge Initiated and Added, Board Property Line Survey and Tour and the planning for the Multipurpose Crossing Bridge Project.

John discussed the summarized the Member Survey Results and highlighted the top responses and the current board actions involving the following areas.

Main Driveway Bridge, Plinking Range, Training Classes / Clinics, Shotgun Range, More Pistol Pits, Paving of the Main Driveway and Small-bore Range Bridge.

John also discussed and summarized other Member Survey responses that were of interest to the board, those being:

Use of Driveway During HOT HP Range, Steel Targets on the Rifle Range, Improved walking Bridges, Movement on the Rifle Ranges, Removal of the NRA Requirement and Club Wide Wi-Fi / Cell Coverage.

John closed with a brief summary of what makes MRPC a first class facility which receives regular compliments from visitors and non-member competitors. The fact that the club has a lengthy waiting list proves the interest in joining shows we're doing many things right. John pointed out that none of this would not be possible without the efforts of volunteers making it happen. John thanked the Board of Directors, Match Directors, the countless volunteers and finally the members in general for making MRPC a fantastic place to enjoy the shooting experience.

John invited questions from the membership.

Q – Can steel targets be installed on the high power range?

A – The topic has been discussed in detail by the board and has not moved forward due to safety concerns.

Q – Can the walking bridges be inspected for needed safety repairs?

A – Yes, the bridges will be assessed for needed repairs.

Q – Is it necessary to be involved with the NRA?

A – Ben Laux fielded the question stating insurance is provided by the NRA for some sanctioned events.

Q – Can benches be installed on the High Power shooting lines and can a 400yd line be added?

A – Ben Laux fielded the question stating the topic has been covered prior and that currently, no discipline requires a 400yd event making the cost to construct a firing line an expense not warranted at this time. John Smith stated that is there was truly an interest volunteers need to step up and form a 400yd committee to more the idea further along.

Honorary Member Present:

John Smith introduced Keith Zimmerman to make the Honorary Member presentation for 2020. After an explanation of the candidate's outstanding support of the MRPC's mission, the board and various shooting disciplines, Keith announced with great gratitude that Lynn Hesel is awarded honorary membership status for all of her years of hard work and dedication to the organization.

New Business:

1. John Smith opened the floor for new business for the membership.

Q – Can a For Sale section be added to the website similar to the one available on the old site?

A – The topic will be discussed at the next Board of Director's meeting.

2. John Smith introduced a proposed change to the Constitution for Article V: Officers, Vice president Property. John distributed the following proposal:




