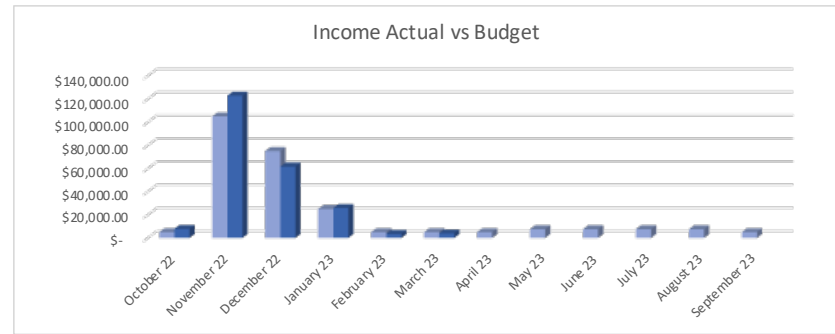
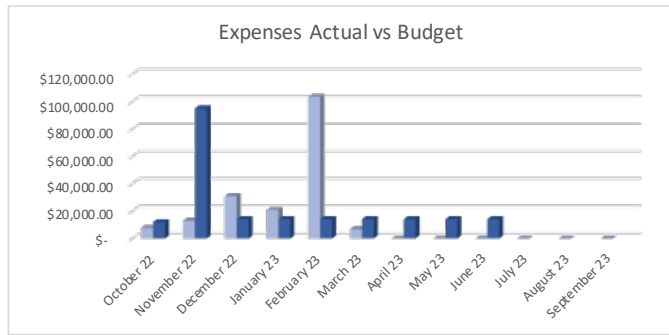

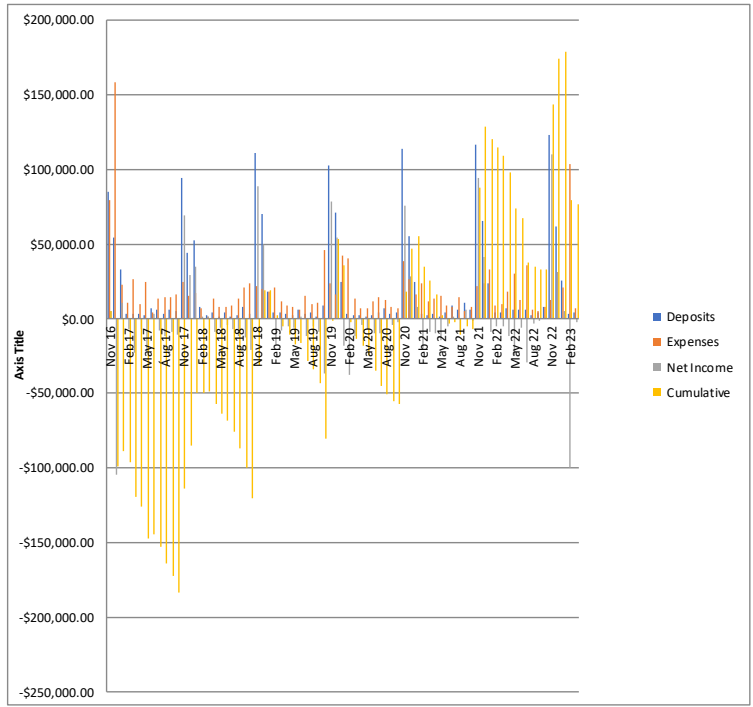

D. Install a 600 yard red light somewhere near the bullseye range. It would be nice if not too expensive. I pack a 600 yard beer for Wednesday Night Steel just in case. Even if we get a light I'll still do it.

E. Add block / stone of a different color on top of the bridge walls. The walls blend in with the road and are pretty short. Eventually someone will drive off.

For someone that doesn't like meetings I've added a bunch of stuff. I'm confident that Mr. Smith can keep things moving.
